This code of practice applies to all postgraduate students who undertake temporary paid teathingure referred to throughout as 'postgraduate tutorsh general such students will be registered for research degrees, since other postgraduate students would not normally undertake teathingterm 'permanent membersof staff' meansfull membersof the academicstaff.

1. Statement of Duties and Pay

- 1.1 All postgraduateutors who are not employed on a contract negotiated through Human Resosinced be given a letter or memorandumby their Headof Department clearly setting out their duties and their pay. This should also cover matters such as experimental are preparation and teachingours, course meetings, pastoral duties, marking, training, Atocopy of this letter should be sent tournan Resources.
- 1.2 Where postgraduate tutors are paid on an hourly basis, hours should be based on a realistic assessment of classroom time and preparation, essay marking, office hours, and attendance at course team or other meetings. The basis of the assessment should be agreed in writing in advance, and payment should normally follow University guidelines.
- 1.3 For postgraduate tutors registered as fullme students teaching time should normally be restricted to a maximum of 6 hours aweek or 180 hours ayear.

2. Selection of Research Students

- 2.1 Departments should publicistheir policy on the recruitment and selection of postgraduate tutokts. research students may be considered as prospective tutors, but it may not be possible to adecting to those who wish it, nor should any student be put under pressure to take teaching. The final decision for such matters rests with the Head of Department of teaching should be annedas far aspossible advance and postgraduate tutors students should be given a smuch notice aspossible of the start of their teaching.
